COURSE ON GLOBAL GOVERNANCE AND BRAZIL

This course aims at assessing global governance from an IR approach and a Brazilian perspective, mainly focused on the sustainability challenge and the environmental agenda. Cases include the BRICS, Brazil, climate and ocean governance.
